This theme is about considering the importance of homes. Children will think about the different homes that people live in and how these are adapted to their needs. They will also consider activities that take place in homes.









The theme this week is based on research or storytelling around people and their achievements.


These can be famous people or people in the community, and these can be based on the interests of the children. It is aimed at encouraging children to consider their attributes and what they might want to be when they grow up.

This theme is based on transport and ways that we get around and move ourselves.










Key Theme:


This theme is based on how we all care for each other and different ways that people do this. Children will be encouraged to consider charity work and to explore the roles of different people in society.









The HIAS Teaching and Learning Team give practical and supportive advice through coaching and mentoring teachers to improve outcomes for all pupils. They use a 'plan, do, review' approach to teaching and learning which broadly includes observation of teaching, personal target setting with areas given to improve, planning, demonstration of lessons and team teaching. The team focus their work on impact within the classroom.

They also work with Senior and Middle Leaders to develop the coaching model in their schools.
